

State of Illinois Health Requirements for the 2017-2018 School Year

Students will **NOT** be able to attend school after October 16, 2017 until **ALL** required information is received.

Requirements by Grade Level:

Preschool Students:

- Physical Exam (Parents please complete the yes/no questions on the back and sign and date)
- Complete immunization record signed and stamped by a doctor: (4) DTap, (3)Polio, (4)Hib, (3)Hep B, (1)MMR, (1)Varicella, (4)Pneumococcal
- Birth Certificate

Kindergarten Students:

- Physical Exam (Parents please complete the yes/no questions on the back and sign and date)
- Complete immunization record signed or stamped by a doctor: (5)DTap, (4)Polio, (4)Hib, (3)Hep B, (2)MMR, (2)Varicella, (4)Pneumococcal
- Dental Exam on Illinois form dated between November 2016-May 2018
- Eye Exam on Illinois form dated within one year of the first day of school
- Birth Certificate

Second Grade Students:

- Dental Exam on Illinois form dated between November 2016-May 2018

Sixth Grade Students:

- Physical Exam (Sports physical NOT acceptable, separate physical needed)(Parents please complete yes/no questions on the back and sign and date)
- Complete immunization record signed and stamped by a doctor, **including** (1)Tdap, (2)Varicella, (1)Meningitis
- Dental Exam on Illinois form dated between November 2016-May 2018

Ninth Grade Students:

- Physical Exam (Sports physical NOT acceptable, separate physical needed on Illinois form)(Parents please complete yes/no questions on the back and sign and date)
- Complete immunization record signed and stamped by a doctor

Twelfth Grade Students:

- Proof of receiving (2)Meningitis: First dose received on or after the 11th birthday and second dose received at least 8 weeks after the first. Only one dose is required if the first dose was received at 16 years of age or older.

Monday October 16, 2017 is the deadline for all required health information

12th Grade Students

For the 2017-2018 school year any child entering the 12th grade shall show proof of having received two doses of meningococcal conjugate vaccine prior to entering the 12th grade. The first dose shall have been received on or after the 11th birthday, and the second dose shall have been received on or after the 16th birthday, at least eight weeks after the first dose. If the first is administered when the child is 16 years of age or older, only one dose is required.

Your healthcare provider, Walgreens, and the Warren County Health Department have options available for various forms of insurance/medicaid.

Proof of receiving the meningitis vaccine must be turned in to the school office no later than **October 16, 2017** or your child could face exclusion from school.
